Globes in the Collection

Indo-Persian celestial Globe Inventory No. 36638

An Indo-Persian celestial globe of the 17th-century, made in bronze. It is not signed or dated, but was probably made in Lahore in about 1660.

There are 57 stars marked on it in addition to the usual circles. It is about 190mm in height.

This globe was bought from Sayyid Bahadur Shah in Lahore, by H. Beveridge, and later sold to Lewis Evans and so it was part of the founding collection of the Museum of the History of Science and is on display in the Museum.
